








Vaccination Rates in KCCD Service Areas

Despite California leading the nation in vaccinations, with more than 44 million doses administered and 75 percent of the eligible population having received at least one dose, the state is seeing increasing numbers of people who refused to get the vaccine being admitted to the ICU and dying."

As of last week, California's statewide case rate more than quadrupled from a low in May of 1.9 cases/100,000/day to at least 9.5 cases/100,000.

Our testing positivity was at a low of 0.7 percent in June, now it has risen to 5.2 percent.

Our hospitalizations were at a low in June of under 900, and we are now approaching 3,000.

The vast majority of new cases are among the unvaccinated, with 600 percent higher case rates among the unvaccinated than for those who are vaccinated.










BC - Campus Pass indicates your ability to come to campus











Vaccination Options for Consideration:

Option 1:

Vaccines required for all employees & students accessing campus facilities

Employees provide evidence of vaccination, or acceptable exemption, to HR Engage in discussion with collective bargaining units

Students provide evidence of vaccination or acceptable exemption
Visitors, vendors, guests, and others would not be subject to the mandate

Option 2:

Vaccines required for only employees

Employees provide evidence of vaccination, or acceptable exemption, to HR Engage in discussion with collective bargaining units

Option 3:

Vaccines are mandated for select students

Students in select programs (eg: ensemble performance) provide evidence of vaccination or acceptable exemption

Option 4:

Vaccines are not mandated

District would remain with Cal/OSHA regulations and public safety orders.







Vaccination Considerations

FDA authorization

On July 29th, the White House announced that it will require all federal employees to provide proof of vaccinations.

On Monday, July 26, Governor Newsom announced that all state employees will be required to show proof of vaccination by August 2 or be subject to weekly testing for COVID-19.

Vaccine Considerations - Higher Education

<u>July 15, 2021:</u> UC Approves Final policy on COVID-19 vaccination policy

In a press release published July 15, the University of California system has released its approved final policy regarding COVID-19 vaccinations on campus.

The UCs will require all students, faculty and staff to be vaccinated with a few medical exceptions, and compliance with the policy will be required two weeks before the start of the fall semester.

release on Tuesday, July 27, the California State University System announced they would also be requiring COVID-19 vaccines for all students, faculty and staff who are accessing campus facilities at any university location. Previously, the CSU had announced they would be mandating vaccines contingent on one or more of the vaccines receiving full FDA approval. Compliance dates will vary between campuses, but all certifications must be completed by September 30.

<u>July 27, 2021: CSU Announces Vaccine Mandate</u>: In a <u>press</u>

In a <u>press release on Tuesday, July 27</u>, Acting Community Colleges Chancellor Daisy Gonzales and Board of Governors President Pamela Haynes urged all students, faculty, and staff to get vaccinated if they haven't already.

The California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office does not have the legal authority to require vaccinations system-wide, but they are encouraging local districts to adopt vaccination mandates - with flexibility for those who cannot get vaccinated for medical or religious reasons.
