Review of Educational Services Organizational Structures

Background:

A request was made to <u>District Consultation Council</u> from Chancellor Christian, Vice Chancellor Means and Associate Vice Chancellor Gerald pertaining to the structure of KCCD's Educational Services organizational structure.

Approach:

The following community college districts were identified as comparable in size and scope to KCCD.

- Los Angeles Community College District
- Los Rios Community College District
- San Diego Community College District, and
- Riverside Community College District

Additionally, a review of the CCCCO organizational structure was conducted to generate additional suggestions. The structure of these districts was reviewed to generate recommendations for KCCD.

Observations:

While each community college district (and the CCCCO) contained some variability in their organizational structures, likely to accommodate unique needs of each entity, a few commonalities emerged:

- Size and Breadth of Chancellor's Cabinet: Each of the community college districts has a more robust team of leaders supporting their respective Chancellors, including Deputy Chancellors (LACCD, Los Rios, and CCCCO), Executive Vice Chancellors, Vice Chancellors, Associate/Assistant Vice Chancellors, Deans and Administrative, Research and/or Program Analysts.
 - The CCCCO is composed of nine (9) divisions led by a Deputy Chancellor, Executive Vice Chancellor, Vice Chancellors, Assistant Vice Chancellors, Deans, and a General Counsel.
- Specialization of Chancellor's Cabinet: Each of the community college districts and the CCCCO divisions were led by a specialist overseeing the division or initiatives, such as:
 - Educational Services and Support
 - Workforce and Economic Development
 - Finance, Business Services and Facilities
 - Digital Innovation, Information Technologies, and Learning Infrastructures
 - Human Resources and Employee Relations
 - Government Relations
 - Institutional Research, Accreditation, Institutional Effectiveness and Strategic Planning
 - Enrollment Management
 - General Counsel
 - Internal Operations
 - Communications, Marketing and Public Relations
 - Institutional Advancement, Foundation and Resource Development

Recommendations:

- Expanding the size and breadth of the KCCD Chancellor's cabinet to include specialized cabinet members including:
 - Deputy Chancellor (similar to CCCCO, LACCD and Los Rios) and/or Executive Vice Chancellor (CCCCO and SDCCD)
 - Vice Chancellor for Educational Services
 - Vice Chancellor for Workforce and Economic Development (similar to CCCCO and Riverside)

- Specialized Associate Vice Chancellors and/or Deans to operationalize, centralize and advance district wide priorities, including:
 - Associate Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs/Services
 - Associate Vice Chancellor for Enrollment Management
 - Dean of Online Learning
